Early RISERs (ages 3-5)

Our early childhood program brings professionals together with families to equip them with knowledge about their child's learning and development to date. Professionals include Occupational Therapists, Speech and Language Pathologists, and Behaviour Interventionists.

RISE One-to-One (ages 6-18)

Our specialized one-to-one instruction helps elementary and secondary students with learning differences succeed academically, building their skills and confidence in and outside of school. Offered in person or online.

Teen Mentorship (ages 15-21)

Our innovative mentorship program includes one-to-one academic and workplace skills-based instruction and a paid work opportunity. We help teens with learning differences transition from high school to paid employment, training, or higher education.

RISE Now (ages 18+)

Our one-to-one program supports adults with suspected or diagnosed learning differences to achieve their specific learning, education, or employment goals.

LDS Access Mobile Classroom

Our mobile classroom delivers one-to-one instruction to neighbourhoods in and around Metro Vancouver.

Family Coaching

Our trained team members provide guidance, strategies, tools, advocacy, and mentorship to help parents and guardians best support their child's learning needs.
